I am so blessed for the ways we have been able to walk together this past year through our mutual desire to help orphans find families. I am consistently humbled by your generous outpourings of love, prayer and donations that have helped children around the world know God's love through the gift of family. On behalf of our entire team – THANK YOU!

I had the privilege to see in person what your generosity accomplished when I watched little Sveta playing with bubbles, knowing that she would get to grow up with her biological brothers, Andrey and Sasha with loving adoptive parents and siblings. Seventeen-year old Vala was cuddling my little baby, Noelle, and told me in her broken English, "My mother is so brave for adopting me and all my brothers and sisters. I do not know where I would be today without her." Your support of these adoptive families made it possible for them to provide the loving homes that Sveta, Andrey, Sasha, Vala and thousands of others so desperately needed.

Yet despite these happy stories, I remain haunted by the memory of Arturos, a boy with greasy hair and a crooked smile who has waited these last seventeen years in an orphanage in Lithuania for a family who never came. He, too, lovingly played with little Noelle, and shrugged shyly when I commented that he was good with little children. What will become of Arturos? Will he ever be able to have healthy relationships and a family of his own? Who will guide him and mentor him as he leaves the orphanage this next year and enters into one of the most formative periods of his life? Will he ever know of God's infinite love for him? It's hard for me to imagine how anyone could understand the unconditional love of an invisible God when they have never experienced unconditional love from other humans.

With your continued help, we pray that more children like Arturos will experience Christ's love through the love of a family, allowing them to become the individuals that God envisioned when he first "knitted them in their mothers' wombs."

We hope that you will be as encouraged as we have been when you read the many stories of how you have already transformed the lives of so many children like Arturos in these following pages!

Finding a family and his voice

Though he is only three years old, Bogdan has struggled through more adversity in his short life than many people experience in their entire lives. Born to an impoverished single mom who neglected him, Bogdan was removed from his dire situation by the government right before his second birthday because social workers feared that he would die if left with his biological mother.

Instead of placing Bogdan in a regular orphanage, Bogdan was placed in an orphanage for deaf-mute children. Bogdan, who had no problems with hearing or speaking, spent a year in silence in the orphanage for deaf-mute children. At the age of three, he was thin, skittish around people, and could not say a single word.

Thanks to your support of the Bogdanovy family, they were able to open their home to Bogdan this year. Since being with the Bogdanovys, Bogdan has made amazing progress! He is gradually losing his fear of people, has gained weight, and has become energetic and inquisitive.

And best of all, at almost 4 years old, Bogdan is finally beginning to talk! His first word was "Mommy." Recently he added "Daddy" to his repertoire of words as well.

In addition to learning to talk, Bogdan has discovered a love of singing and dancing in his new family. Imagine what Bogdan would have missed out on had he stayed in the deaf-mute orphanage and not been brought into a loving family!

Provided a loving home for three disabled orphans



Thanks to the generous giving of Doorway's donors, the Novikov's are expanding their home to adopt three more special needs children!

Four years ago, Nikolai and Natalia felt God calling them to adopt three boys with special needs. People with disabilities are looked down on in Ukraine, and adoption of special needs orphans is quite rare. In fact, Child Services told the Novikovs that if they adopted Vanka (their first adopted son), he would bring them nothing but trouble.

However, the Novikovs ignored social standards and followed what they felt God calling them to do. They adopted Vanka, Vitya, and Vanya, who have all thrived in their family.

This year, the Novikovs felt God calling them to adopt again—three special needs children, two girls and a boy: Nikita (12), Diana (9), and Lutfia (5). However, the government wouldn't let them adopt because their home was too small.

Helped 20+ former orphans bike across Russia to promote adoption

For the past three summers, your gifts have not only supported former orphans as they rode more than 1,000 miles on behalf of adoption, but it also provided families for orphans!

Five years ago, the Isaevs adopted Dasha, an active, very social six-year-old who they knew had HIV and Hepatitis C. Last year, when the Doorways to Hope team visited the Isaevs, nine year old Dasha was in the hospital with Hepatitis that had destroyed 50% of her liver. Thanks to your generous giving, doctors were able to provide Dasha with critically needed medical care over the past year. She is now back home with her family and doing well!



Motivated families in Russia & Ukraine to adopt

Sweet baby Philip's adoption was a direct result of your financial support. Your gifts allowed Sergei, a Ukrainian pastor, to share God's vision of emptying orphanages through adoption. Philip's adoptive parents heard Sergei speak and as a result were moved to adopt Philip. They brought him home this summer!

Five of their children are adopted, and as a result of sharing their powerful testimony approximately 100 children have been adopted by people inspired by their message! She no longer needs to carry two of her disabled children through the precarious mud and slush to get to the car. Thank you!



The cycle of orphanhood stops with Andrei and Olesya Chernishov. Orphans themselves, Andrei and Olesya have adopted 4 daughters! When Olesya became pregnant with their first biological child last year, she quietly dreamed of having running water in the house. None of them ever had this luxury! Thanks to your generous gift, Andrei was able to install running water, and remodel their dilapidated (or "broken-down") kitchen and bath. Andrei completed the remodel just as Olesya was coming home from the hospital with their new baby. Thank you for making Olesya's life long dream come true and enabling her to better care for her children!

From Abuse to **Endearment**

Just a year ago we asked you to pray for Vlada, a charismatic 8-year-old who often asked, "When will someone come to get me?" She prayed continuously for loving parents.

We're thrilled to report that your prayers—and hers—have been answered! A Ukrainian family adopted her at the beginning of this year.

Vlada's journey to a loving home has not been easy. Her mother's parental rights were terminated when Vlada was very young. She then lived with her father, who had remarried. Child Services intervened again when Vlada ran away to escape the cruel physical abuse and starvation that her stepmother had inflicted. At this point, her father's parental rights were also terminated.

When a couple in Ukraine accepted Vlada with all the love they had to share, she was ecstatic. Since her adoption, she has made huge progress in school. She is very artistic and likes to sing and act in theater productions. Thank you for praying Vlada into a place where she is blossoming and beginning to believe in her future!



This past year, the vision of "a World Without Orphans" started spreading beyond Eastern Europe to the rest of the world! Doorways to Hope played an integral part in spreading this vision through its role of distributing grant funding to specific programs under the World Without Orphans Movement. While we are proud to be key supporters of this movement, it is a movement that is growing and changing the face of orphan care around the world because many organizations and talented individuals are giving their time and talents in a unified effort.

You may remember us telling you about Russian and Ukrainian churches and non-profits forming alliances with the goal of getting kids out of orphanages and into families. Other countries were so inspired by the amazing results of these alliances that they started forming their own national alliances - but often they realized that they needed help! They needed training on how to unite leaders on this common goal of getting orphans into families. They needed training on how to create advocacy packages for their governments in order to develop systems that would support adoption and foster care. They needed resources to provide families with adequate training and support to become adoptive and foster families. The list goes on and on.

The World Without Orphans Movement is addressing these requests for help from nations and regions around the world as they strive to help orphans find families in their home countries.





In light of these realities, we believe Doorways to Hope's strategy of empowering Christian families in foreign countries to domestically adopt the orphans within their own communities has the greatest potential to significantly reduce the number of orphans in the world. I cannot emphasize this point enough, and this novel and unique approach is what sets Doorways to Hope apart from other organizations.

The board of directors for Doorways to Hope has remained highly committed over the past year to ensuring responsible governance, transparency, and financial accountability. We
